


Figures of Speech

Personification is a figure of speech which attributes human qualities to something that is not human.

are portrayed in such a  
way that we feel they  
have the ability to act  
like human beings.

Personification is quite expressive but is not meant to be taken literally.

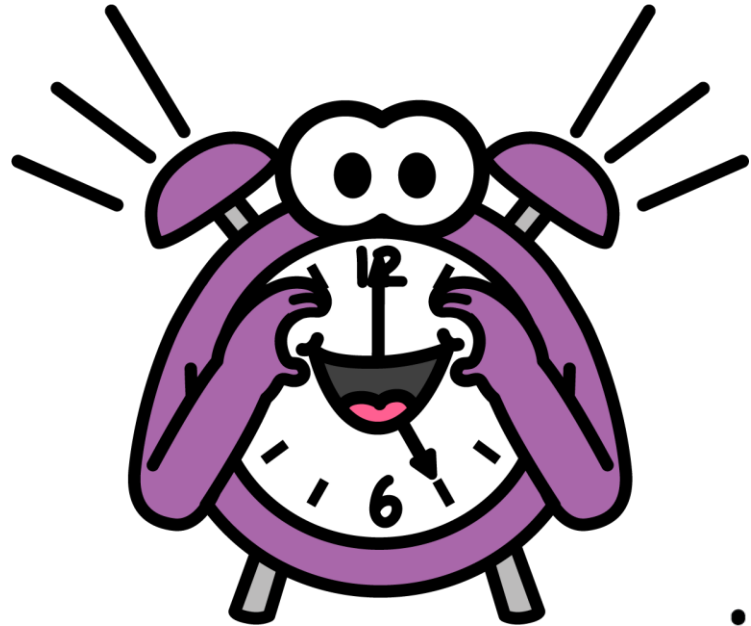
Using personification in your written work adds colour to the text and helps the reader to create "mind images".
