

General Election Constituencies

In Ireland, there are currently 39 constituencies for General Elections and By-Elections. 11 of these constituencies are located in the greater Dublin area. The level of population in an area determines the size of constituencies. Constituencies may elect three, four or five people in an election. General Elections are held at least every five years. The following is a list of the various constituencies throughout the country and the number of TDs elected by each constituency.
