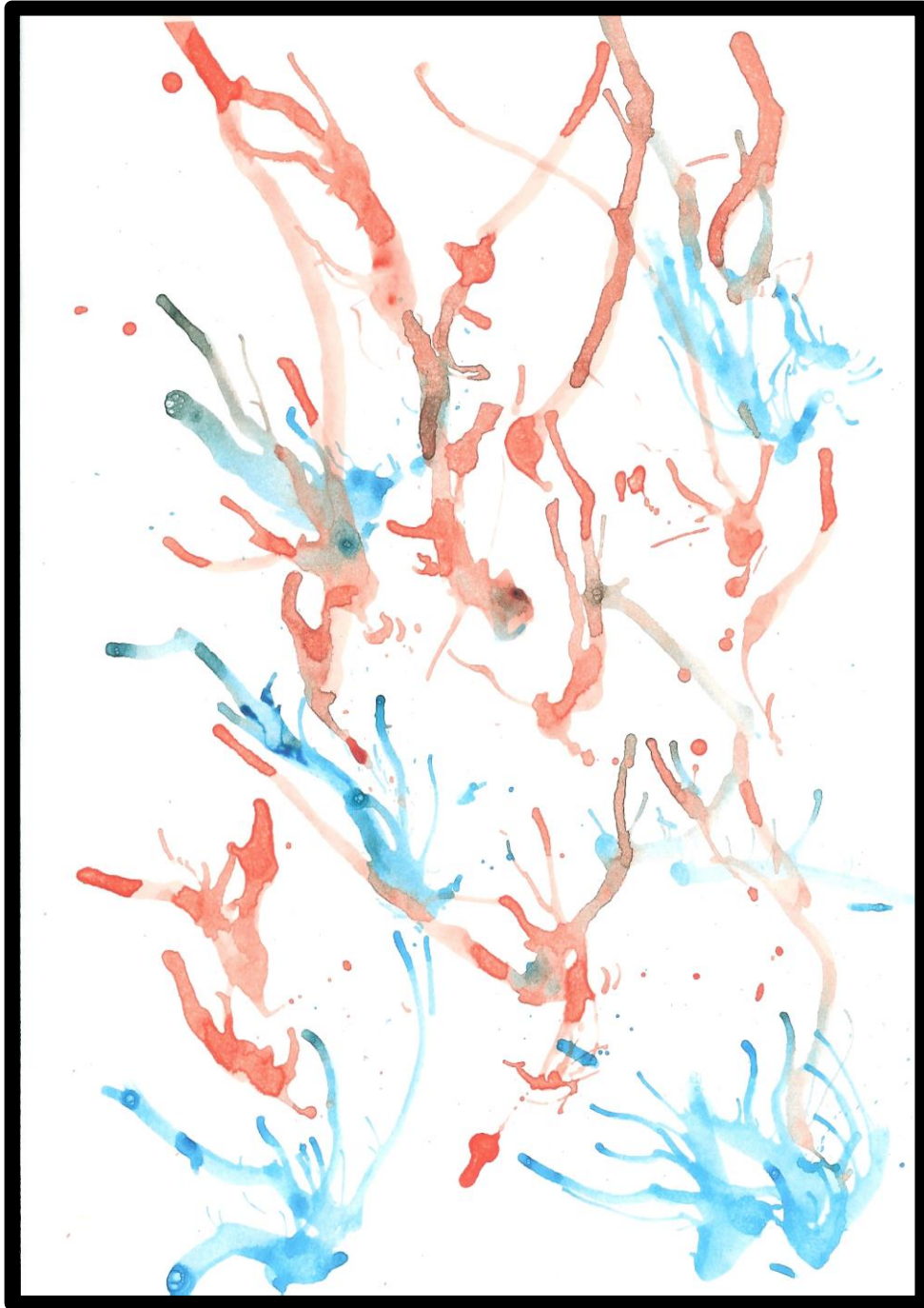


# BLOW PAINTING

1. This is a really easy lesson to do, yet it is one which the children will really enjoy.
2. A4 paper is probably big enough for this lesson. Try to use a heavier art paper rather than photocopier paper which doesn't hold watery paint very well.
3. Pour some poster paints into plastic cups or jars and thin down using water.
4. Using old teaspoons, pour drops of different colour paints all over the page.
5. Using recyclable drinking straws, blow the watery paints in all different directions over the page. Allow the different colour paints to overlap, giving new colours as the paints mix.
6. When all the paint has been "blown" all over the page, allow the painting to dry.
7. Display the finished paintings all together to form a great abstract painting display.
