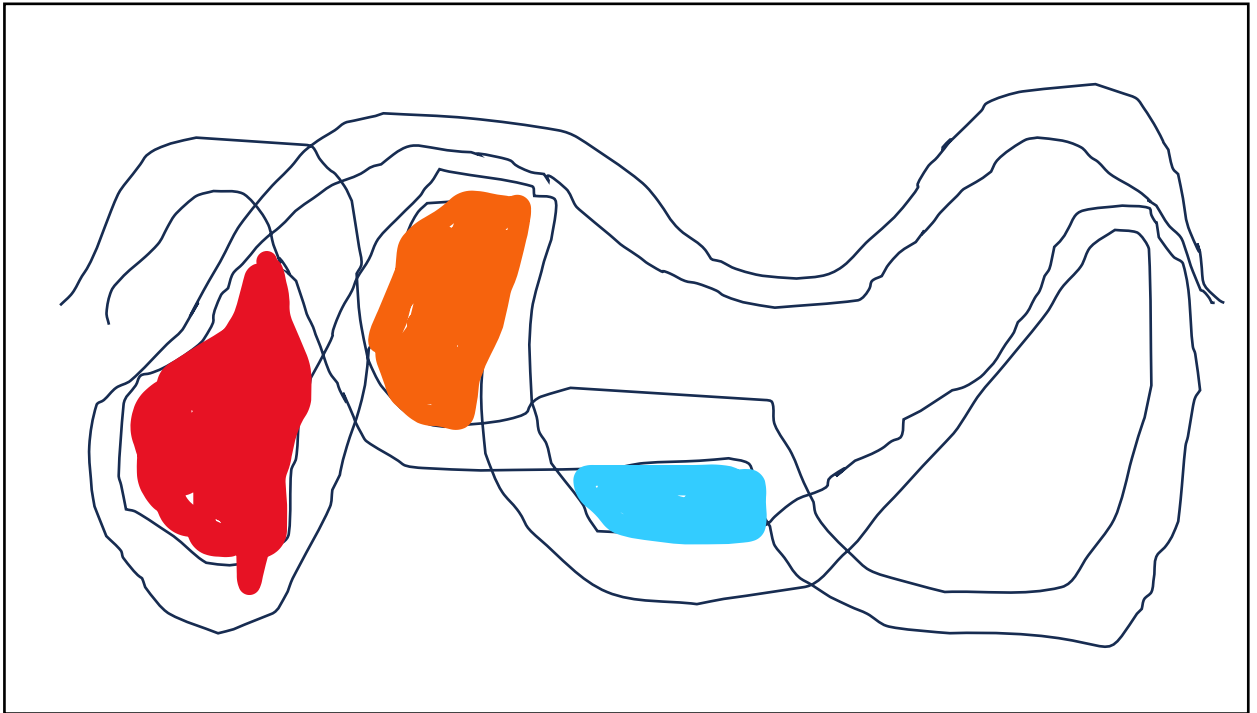


SCRAFITTI ART

1. This lesson starts with a "Take a line for a Walk" lesson that may have been done in infant classes. It should be explained to pupils to ensure that the spaces between lines are large. Make sure also to use up as much space as possible all over the page. When this is done take another line for a walk, about 1-2cm from the original line, thus creating a double line all around the page.
2. Using wax crayons, colour the large spaces between the lines. Ensure that pupils lean really hard on the crayons to create deep, vivid colours – this is really important. Try to ensure that there is no section or piece of a section left uncoloured. The background space should also be coloured in a single colour. (If pupils have leaned hard enough with the crayon, their hands should be sore at this point!!) Do not colour between the double line.
3. When all the crayon work is completed, paint over the whole page with thick black paint. Do not spread the paint too thinly as the idea is to block out all the crayon colours.
4. Allow the painting to dry on a flat surface over a few days.
5. When the paint is dry, use a lollipop stick or some other blunt instrument to scratch patterns into the black paint that is covering the wax crayon sections.

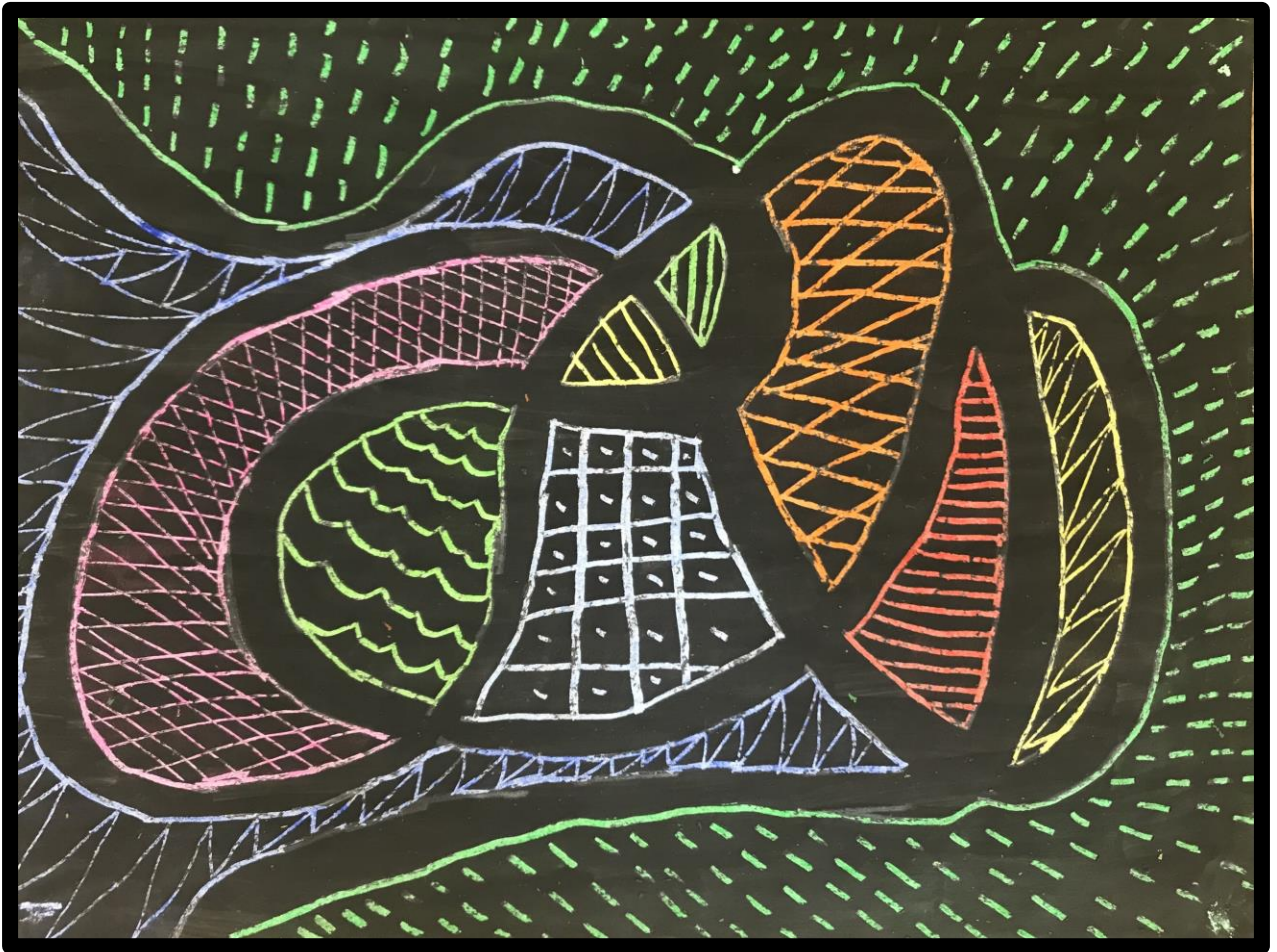
Step 2



Begin to fill in the different sections in different colours with wax crayons, but don't fill in the double line. Then completely cover the page in thick black paint.

Step 3



Using a lollipop stick or other blunt instrument, scratch patterns in the paint sections that are covering the wax crayons to reveal the colours underneath.
