

HALLOWE'EN SILHOUETTE 02

This is quite a simple and easy art lesson to do, yet it is one which pupils in middle/senior classes will enjoy. It is probably best to do it in two stages, leaving time for paint to dry after the first stage.

1. Place the sheet of art paper in landscape mode.
2. Using the three primary colours (blue, red, yellow), quickly, using forward and backward strokes, (using paintbrush or sponge) paint the background of the page, starting with blue at the top of the page, followed by red and then yellow. Allow the paints to overlap on the page, thereby creating new colours as they mix.
3. Allow this paint to dry.
4. Using black sugar paper or black card, cut out a rooftop silhouette scene. Try to get different shape roofs and different size houses. Stick the black silhouette to the bottom of the background art sheet.
5. Cut pieces of fluorescent paper/card into small square/rectangular shapes. Stick these onto the black silhouette to represent light coming from inside the houses/buildings.
6. Cut out Halloween shapes (e.g. witch, moon, black cat) and stick these onto the sky area of the picture.
7. Some small scraps of the fluorescent paper could be stuck onto the sky area to represent stars.
