PAPER WEAVING

• Select two contrasting coloured sheets of A4 paper or preferably card.

Place one sheet portrait-wise in front of you. Fold this sheet in half.
Cut strips into this sheet from the <u>closed</u> end 2cm apart as far as a line 2cm from the top. (See Step I below)

• Re-open the sheet into portrait orientation and flatten out.

• Place second sheet of coloured A4 paper in a portrait orientation on the table. Measure horizontal lines on this sheet 2cm apart and cut into strips. (See Step 2 below)

• Weave these strips into the first sheet in an under-over fashion. If you start first strip "under-over", start the second strip "over-under" and so on with the remaining strips. Push the strips close together so that they "knit" together and keep the sheet tight. You should end up with a pattern of 2cm squares. The ends of the strips can be secured using Pritt Stick.


• Mount paper weavings onto sugar paper of a complimentary colour and display.




Variations


- Try cutting the lines on the first sheet of paper in a zig-zag fashion and weave as before.
- Try cutting the strips of the second sheets in a zig-zag pattern and weave as before.
- Try cutting both the first and second sheets in a zig-zag pattern and weave as before.
- Try cutting using Tilly scissors and see what results.
- Apply a Paper Weaving technique to other art lessons, e.g. fish and Valentine's hearts (see examples below)







