MATCHSTICK PICTURE

- I. Get A4 black card and place it in portrait mode on the table.
- 2. Glue matchsticks onto the card in the shape of a tree. Work on forming the skeleton of the tree including a main trunk and extending branches.
- 3. Use the idea of symmetry from maths to cut symmetrical leaves of different sizes. (Fold sheets of green card into different widths and cut half a leaf shape from the closed side of the sheet to get symmetrical leaves.)
- 4. Dip the tips of the leaves into PVA glue and position around the branches. By only gluing a piece of the leaves gives a 3-D look to the picture as most of the leaf should be lifting off the page.
- 5. Cut out grass shape and glue along the bottom of the picture.
- 6. Allow the glue to dry overnight before displaying the pictures.

Variations

- I. Use different shades of green card for the leaves.
- 2. Use many different colours for the leaves to show trees in different seasons.
- 3. Show some leaves falling from the trees to show Autumn trees.
- 4. Think up of other pictures that can be displayed using the matchstick and paper idea. E.g. flowers, animals etc.
