HEART PAPER WEAVING

• Select two contrasting coloured sheets of A4 paper or preferably card. As this art lesson ties in with Valentines' Day, red, pink and white card might be appropriate.

• On both pieces of card, mark a spot half way across the top at the IO.5cm mark (See Step I below). Mark a spot 6cm down from the top on both sides. Use a large plate or other curved shape to create a semi circle going from the IO.5cm line to both sides at the 6cm point. Cut off the semi-circle at the top

• Draw a horizontal line at the bottom of the semi-circle at the top of the page. Draw vertical lines from this line to the bottom of the page, each line 2cm apart (See Step 2 below). Do this to both pieces of card.

• Cut along all of the vertical lines as far as the horizontal line.


• Place the two pieces of card perpendicular to each other.


• Weave the loose strips into each other in an under-over fashion. If you start first strip "under-over", start the second strip "over-under" and so on with the remaining strips. Push the strips close together so that they "knit" together and keep the sheet tight. You should end up with a pattern of 2cm squares. The ends of the strips can be secured using Pritt Stick. Cut off any excess card along the side


• Mount paper weavings onto sugar paper or a complimentary colour and display.


