

FLYING KITE ART

This is a nice visual arts lesson to do during the summer term. It can be done as a standalone art lesson, however, I have also used these as a cover for an art portfolio.

1. If desired, measure a 2cm border around the outside of an art page. This can be coloured at the end, or just outlined as in the sample below.
2. Draw the outline of a stylised kite near the centre of the page.
3. From the top right corner of the page, draw diagonal lines as far as the kite. Split the spaces in between these diagonal lines by drawing lines in a "drop brick" design. Make sure that the spaces are not too small.
4. Split the centre of the page into field-like shapes. Again, make sure that the spaces are not too small.
5. Split the bottom of the page into wavy sea-like sections.
6. Apart from the kite, the page is now split into roughly three sections – sky, land and sea.
7. Discuss colours suitable for the sky, land and sea sections. Use these colours to colour in the different areas of the picture. Each area should have its own colour scheme, different to the other two sections.

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8. Colour the kite any colour and add in facial features.
9. Go over all the lines with black to make the colours stand out.
