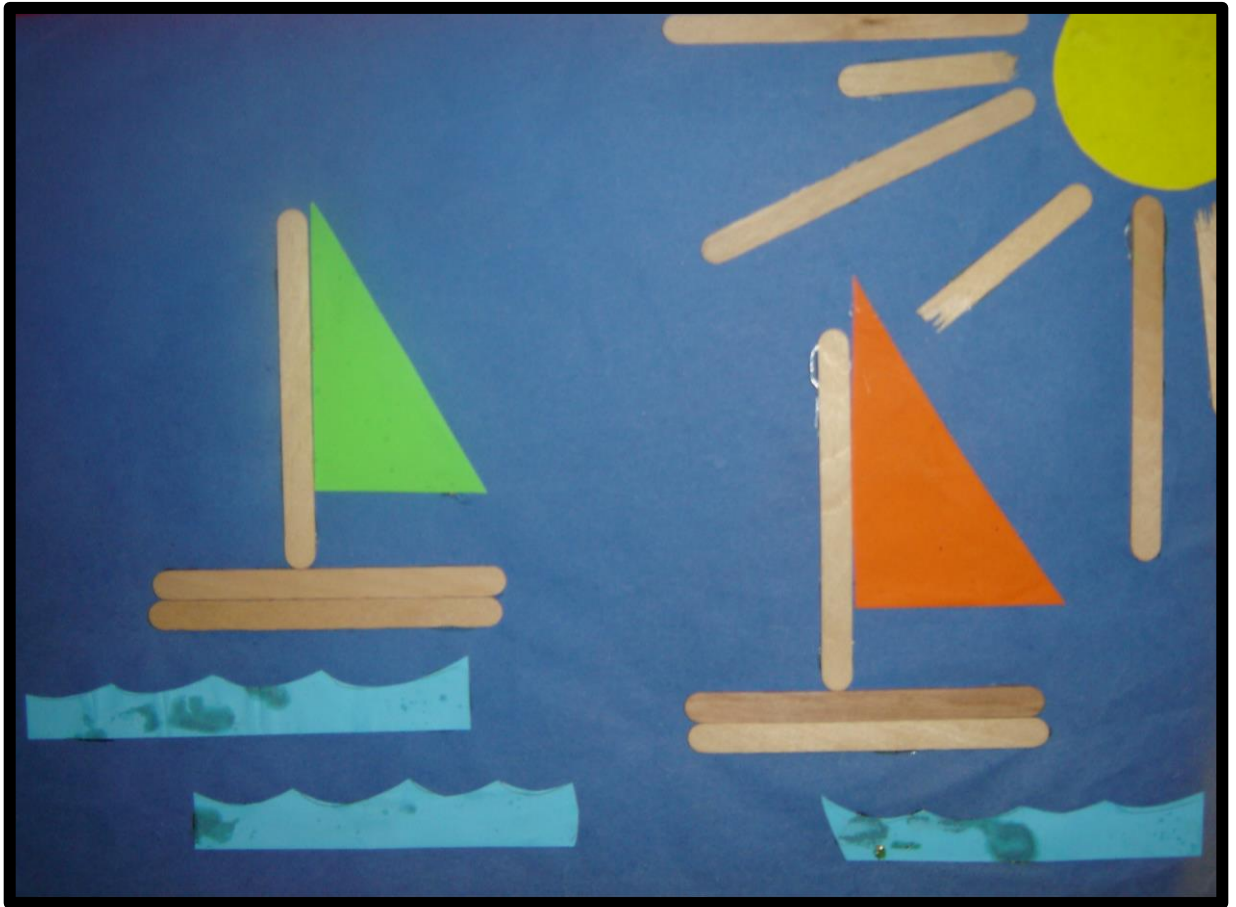


LOLLIPOP SEASCAPE

This is a nice visual arts lesson to do during the summer term. It can be done as a standalone art lesson, or it can be done as part of a "Sea" theme in the classroom.

1. This picture could be completed on a sheet of blue sugar paper to act as the sea background.
2. Alternatively, you could paint a blue background on a sheet of art paper using a brush or sponge. Try to get the effect of having a darker blue near the bottom for the sea and a lighter blue near the top for the sky. This can be done simply by spreading the paint a little thinner near the top. You could also use some white paint to mix a lighter shade of blue for a sky area of the page.
3. To create the boating scene, glue two lollipop sticks for the bottom of the boats in two different areas of the page.
4. Glue a vertical lollipop as the mast for each boat.
5. Glue triangles of coloured paper for the sails.
6. Glue blue paper, which has been cut into wave shapes, onto the bottom of the picture.
7. Glue a yellow/orange circle in one corner of the page for the sun.
8. Glue full and half lollipop sticks as the rays of the sun.
9. Allow to dry overnight before displaying on a display board.
