

COLOUR PATTERN ART

Pattern 1

1. Using a light pencil and ruler, spilt your art page into four rows of four, ending up with sixteen equal sections (see Sample 1).
2. Using wax crayons, choose four colours that you think go well together. This could be combined with a lesson on something like warm and cool colours, autumn colours, sea colours, secondary colours etc.
3. Give each of your four colours a number from 1 to 4.
4. Colour the page in the following order:

1	2	3	4
4	1	2	3
3	4	1	2
2	3	4	1

5. When coloured, trace over all the lines in black using a ruler.
6. A black border could be included at the beginning before ruling out the page.
7. These images form a great display when hung on the wall together, almost looking like a patchwork quilt.

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Alternatives

1. Do the picture using poster paints and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
2. Do the picture using chalk pastels and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
3. Pupils could come up with their own numbered pattern for this lesson.

Pattern 2

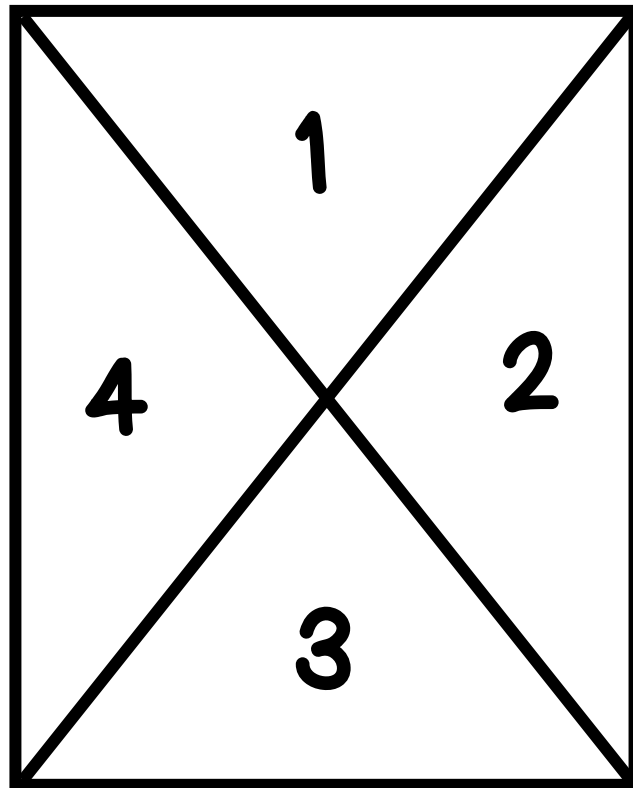
1. Using a light pencil and ruler, split your art page into four by drawing a vertical and horizontal line in the middle of the page. In each of the four sections draw two diagonal lines, splitting the quarter into four triangles. (see pattern below)
2. Using wax crayons, choose four colours that you think go well together. This could be combined with a lesson on something like warm and cool colours, autumn colours, sea colours, secondary colours etc.
3. Give each of your four colours a number from 1 to 4.
4. Colour each quarter of the page using the pattern outlined on the next page.
5. When coloured, go over all the lines in black using a ruler.

Alternatives

1. Do the picture using poster paints and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
2. Do the picture using chalk pastels and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
3. Pupils could come up with their own numbered pattern for this lesson.

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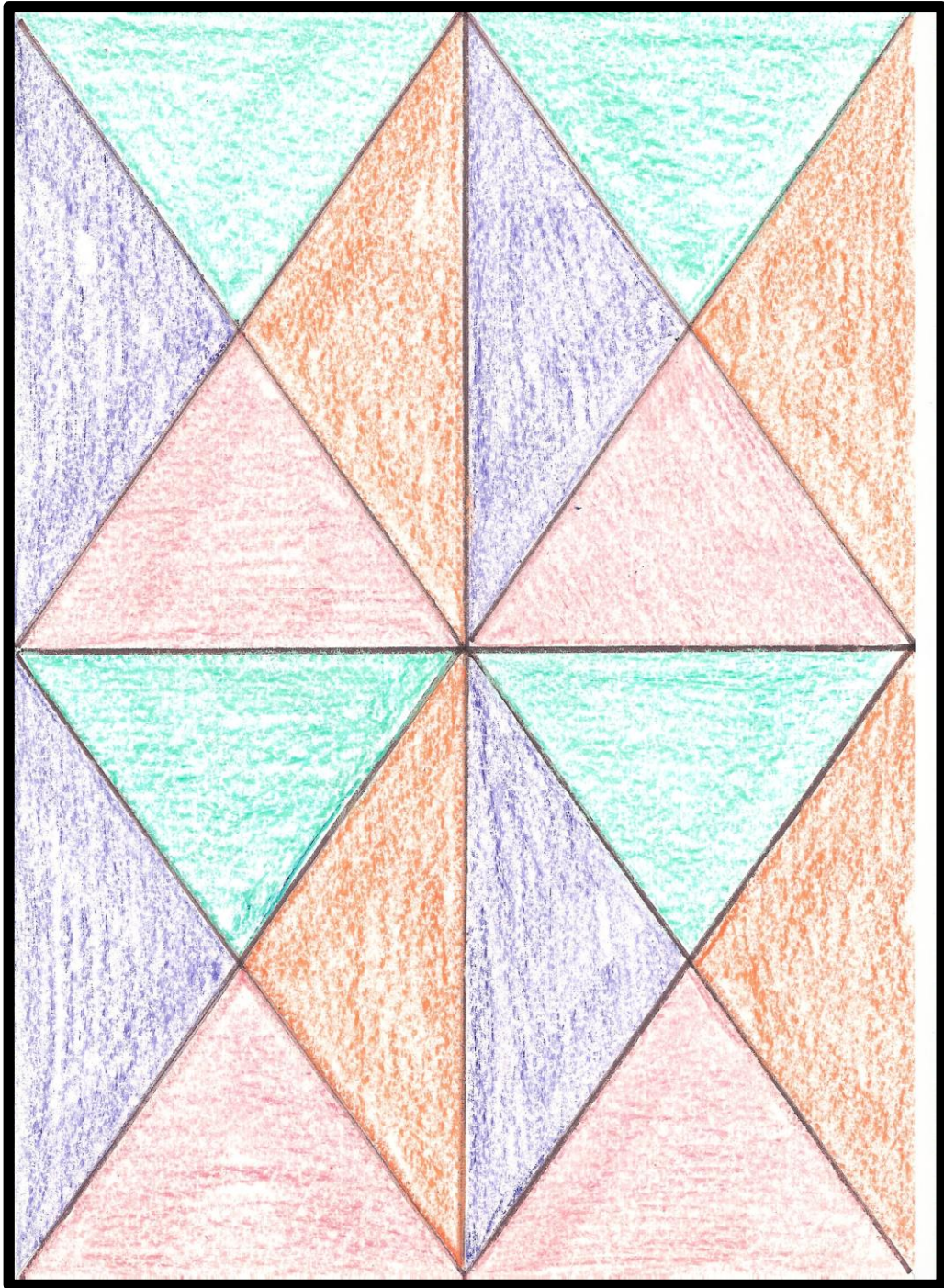
