

FUCHSIA ART

1. Observe a growing fuchsia plant. Observe the shape of the flowers, both the open and closed buds. Observe the colours of the flowers. Observe the way the flowers grow – they hang down rather than grow up.
2. Fold an A3 art page in half in a portrait orientation.
3. Open the page and draw a border on each half of the page.
4. Using crayons, draw large and small fuchsia flowers hanging, using the shapes and colours from your observations.
5. Draw stems and leaves for each flower.
6. Do a rubbing in green of a brick from the classroom wall as a background for the picture.
7. Colour the border black or use a rubbing technique for the border background. (see Sample 1)
8. Display completed pictures to form a fuchsia wall.

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Alternatives

1. Do the picture using poster paints and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
2. Do the picture using chalk pastels and observe the difference from the wax crayon picture.
3. Cut out the shapes from coloured paper and stick on. Observe the difference from the wax crayon picture. (see Sample 2)
